What makes these lessons, courses and resources special?

- 1. They have been prepared by well-qualified people.
- 2. They are written in simple English, avoiding big words and long sentences, so people whose native tongue is not English can understand them easily.
- 3. They move step-by-step, so it is easy to see how each point leads to the next one and there is advice about how to avoid common errors.
- 4. They are constantly updated, to keep abreast of modern scholarship, and to make them easier to understand, with extra resources to give students a wider understanding of what they are studying..
- 5. There is a sense of context the world in which composers, artists and writers lived, and the places, events and ideas that shaped their work.
- 6. There are examples of from music, literature and art of the time in which a work was created.
- 7. Courses are based on sound research, not only book-knowledge but also visits to the places where artists, philosophers, authors and composers lived, and understanding of the music they wrote and the instruments they wrote for.
